



Affiliated Network for Social Accountability in the Arab World (ANSA-Arab World)

The First Regional Network that brings together the different stakeholders in the field of social accountability in the Arab World namely: the government, the civil society, the media and the private sector. In October 2010, CARE-International in Egypt, in cooperation with the World Bank, organized the first regional workshop on social accountability in which participants expressed their interest in the establishment of a network that promotes the values and practices of social accountability.

The ANSA-AW was officially launched at the Regional Launch Conference that was held in Rabat, Morocco in March 2012. The conference was attended by 100 representatives of the civil society, the government, the private sector and media personnel in addition to a number of donors and regional and international social accountability practitioners.

The ANSA-AW currently includes members from seven Arab countries (Morocco, Tunisia, Egypt, Palestine, Jordan, Lebanon, and Yemen) and is open for more members from other Arab countries. CARE-International in Egypt carries out the executive secretarial roles for the network with technical and financial support from the World Bank.
